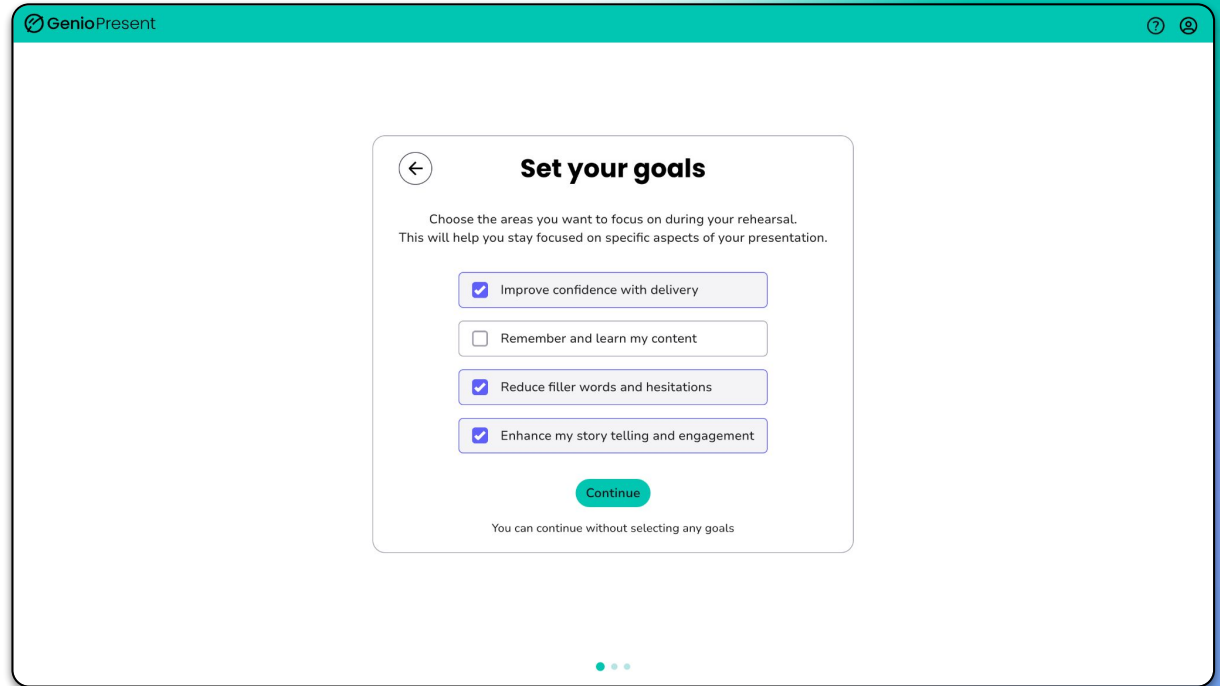

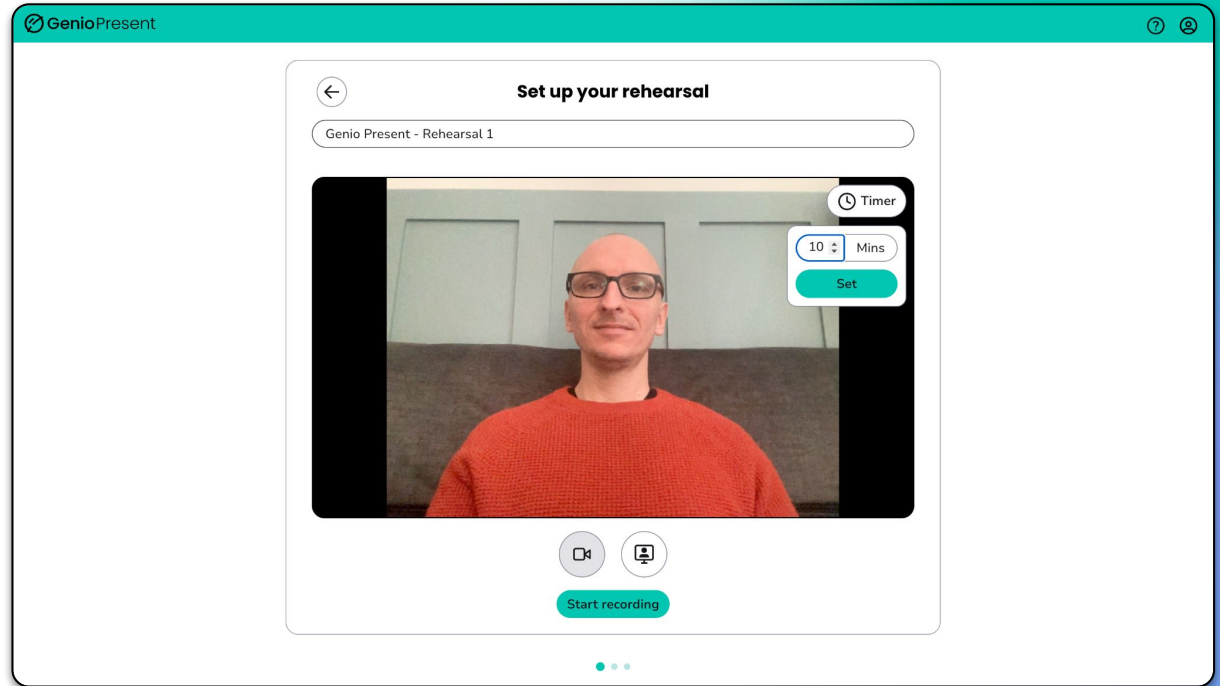
Set custom goals to help you focus on specific areas of your delivery

- ▶ Focus on **improving confidence** with delivery, remembering content, reducing filler words and hesitations, and enhancing storytelling and engagement.



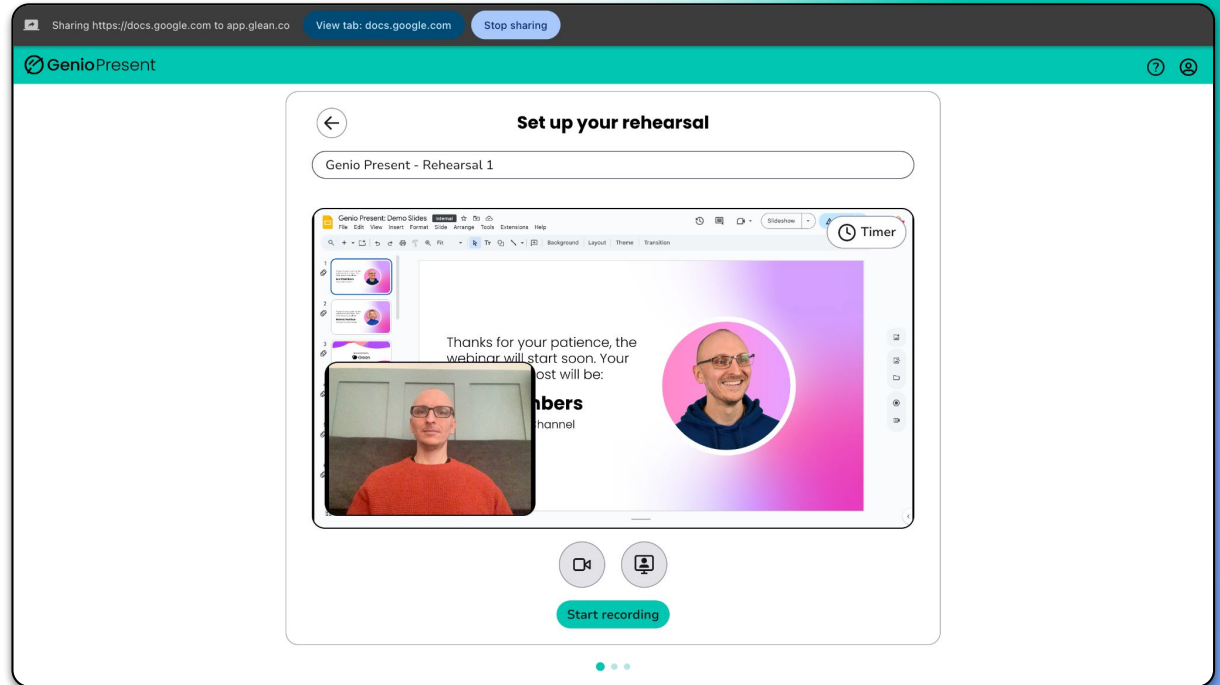
Rehearse in a safe space, capturing your audio and webcam video

- ▶ Build **strong retrieval pathways** by encouraging multiple rehearsals.



Capture slides, from Powerpoint, Google, Canva, Prezi, and more

Playback rehearsals at your own pace with synchronised transcripts

- ▶ Review rehearsals and **process the information** at your own pace.
- ▶ Analysing **audio and visuals** enables you to identify areas for improvement in both verbal and non-verbal communication.
- ▶ The **transcript** further supports comprehension and includes any **disfluencies** (uh, um etc.) to help you identify and reduce them.

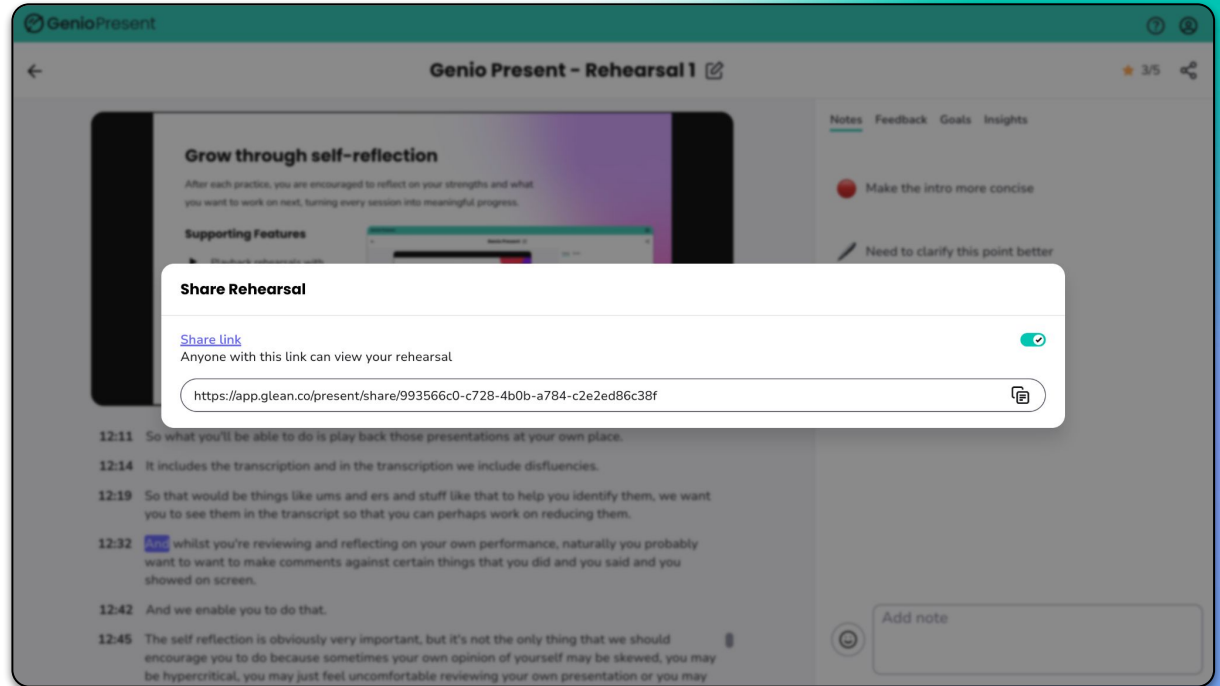


Share rehearsals with peers and mentors to gather external feedback

- ▶ Sharing a rehearsal facilitates observational learning and allows for **feedback from peers, coaches or mentors**.
- ▶ Feedback provides valuable insights into how a presentation is perceived by others, **helping identify strengths and areas for improvement** that might not be obvious to the presenter.



Feedback is linked to specific moments of your presentation rehearsal

- ▶ Timestamped comments connect feedback directly to specific moments, making suggestions **easier to act on**.
- ▶ Encourages gradual exposure to feedback in a low-pressure way, supporting confidence-building.
- ▶ Feedback can be anonymous, which encourages more **honest and candid responses** by removing the fear of judgment or reprisal.

Get encouraging, specific AI insights that promote progress



Track practice and improvement over time to help build confidence

- ▶ Students see **visible evidence** of their improvement - reinforcing motivation and self-efficacy.
- ▶ Encourages independent, repeatable learning.
- ▶ A meaningful way to **measure confidence building**, something which is often hard to quantify with other forms of support.
