WCAG 2.1 AA compliant features

WCAG compliance allows those with disabilities, as well as temporary ailments, to have the same online experience as anybody else. Genio Notes boasts accessibility features such as accessible button names, the ability to disable shortcuts, optimal color contrast, and visible focus outlines.



Enhanced accessibility features

Additional features such as **Quick actions**, **lightning mode**, **and dark mode** might not be included in the WCAG guidelines, but they're still important for users!



No gimmicks

Features like accessibility overlays can make software unusable for some learners using assistive technology. This creates a poor experience which prevents them from engaging with the product effectively, if at all. Our accessibility by design approach means we never use features for vanity, and instead find solutions that work.
